This week, in EYFS we learned how to weave by making our own Bible bookmarks! Now we can keep track of where we've read and show off our colourful creations.

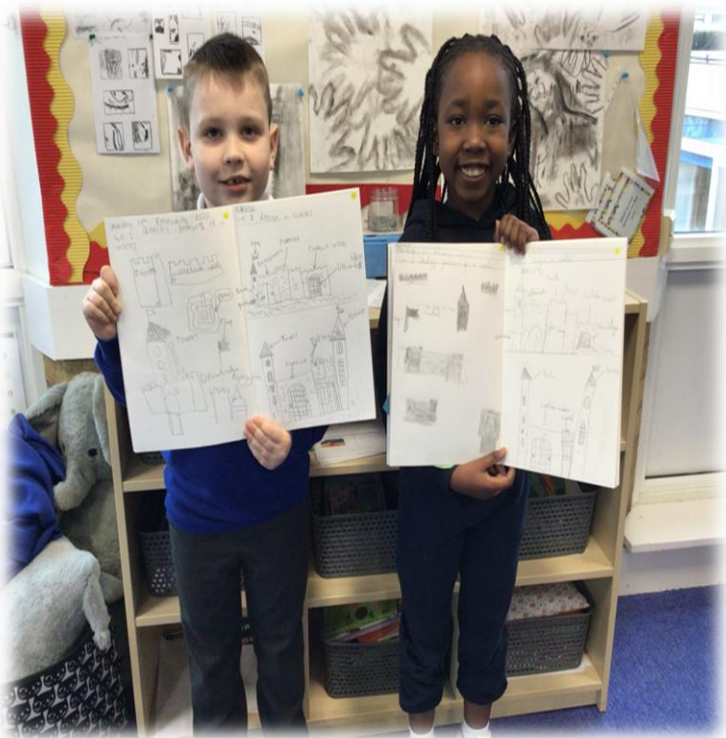
Year 1



This week, in Year 1 we have been practising our skills using kinetic letters. The children showed great concentration and enthusiasm as they practised their fine motor skills. We are very proud of the progress they are making as they continue to develop strong handwriting foundations.

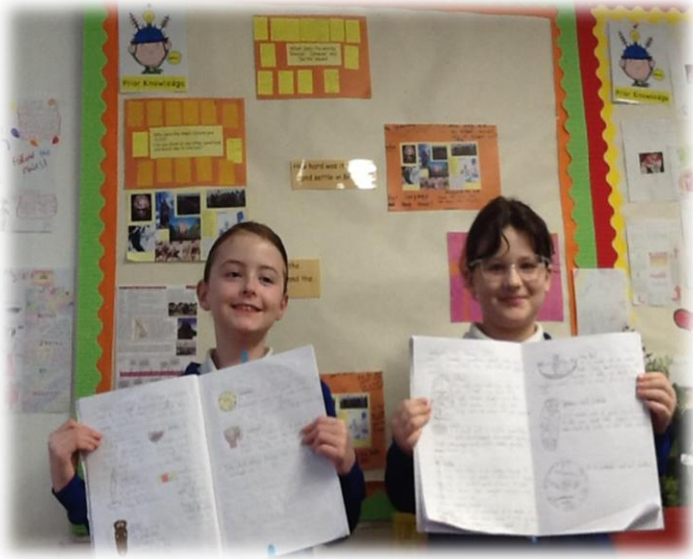
Year 2

In English this week, Year 2 enjoyed taking their learning outdoors as they explored different types of leaves. The children carefully observed the shapes, sizes, colours and textures of the leaves they found. The children used ambitious adjectives to describe them. We were so impressed with their curiosity, teamwork and thoughtful discussions during our outdoor learning!



Year 3 have started their new DT topic and were very excited about it. They have been learning about the key features of castles and what they were used for in the past. Then they worked with a partner to design their own castles and shared ideas together. They had lots of fun and made sure they identified all the features used in their designs. The children are now looking forward to building their castles!

Year 4



This week in Year 4, the children have been exploring the fascinating discovery of Sutton Hoo in their History lessons. They examined a range of artefacts found at the site, learning about the materials they were made from, their purpose, and who they may have belonged to. The class discovered that Sutton Hoo was the burial site of an Anglo-Saxon king named King Rædwald, and that the remarkable find was uncovered in 1939 beneath a large mound on the estate of Mrs Pretty. The children have really enjoyed uncovering the clues these artefacts give us about life in Anglo-Saxon times.

Year 5



This week in Year 5, we've had a fantastic time designing and building spaghetti bridges in our DT project. Through lots of testing (and a few dramatic snaps!), we explored how strong shapes like triangles can make structures more stable. We also discovered how layering materials together increases strength and helps spread weight more evenly. It's been a fun and hands-on way to learn about engineering, problem-solving, and teamwork!

YEAR 6



In Design and Technology this week, Year 6 have explored mechanical toys and discussed how they work. The children carefully observed the moving parts and shared their ideas about how the mechanism might create movement. They answered key questions about what makes a toy mechanical, how motion is created, and what components might be hidden inside. This sparked lots of curiosity and thoughtful discussion as they began exploring how cams and mechanisms can bring toys to life.

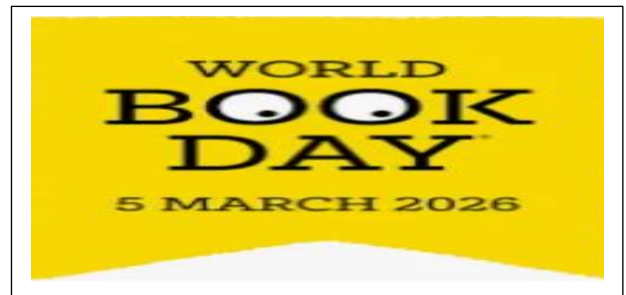
Join us for our Books & Breakfast event!
