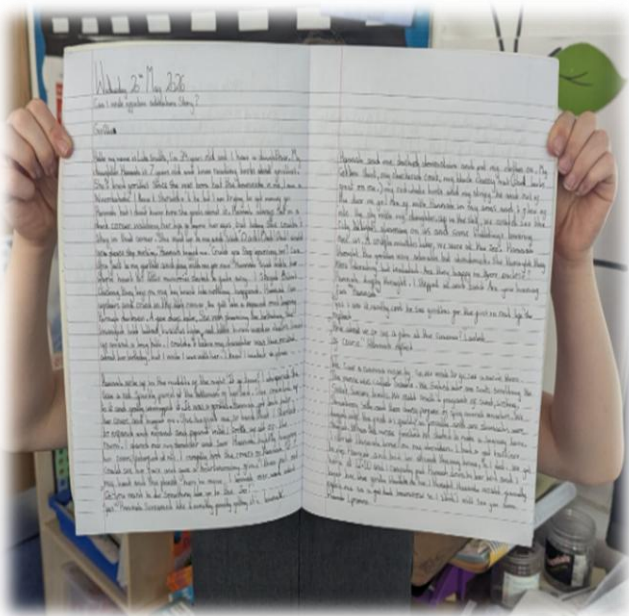
YEAR 4
